only at the direction of the Court.

(4) Any brief accompanying a motion shall not exceed 30 pages absent leave of

court.

(5) For cases that are specially set for trial, any dispositive or *Daubert* motion

shall be filed no later than 120 days prior to the scheduled trial. A dispositive

motion filed within 120 days of a specially set trial will be deemed in violation

of U.S.C.R. ¶ 6.6 and considered untimely.
